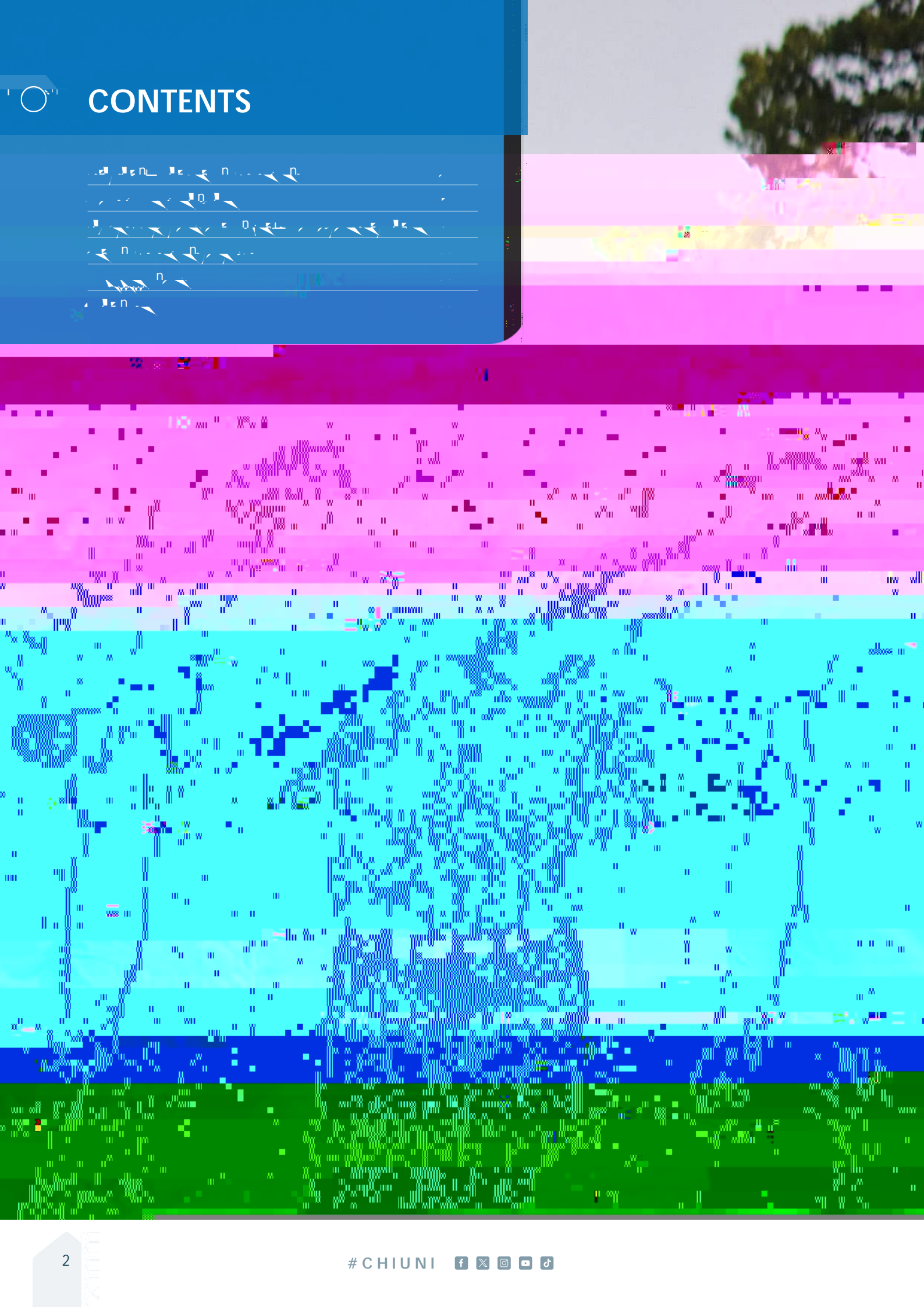

What is a personal statement?

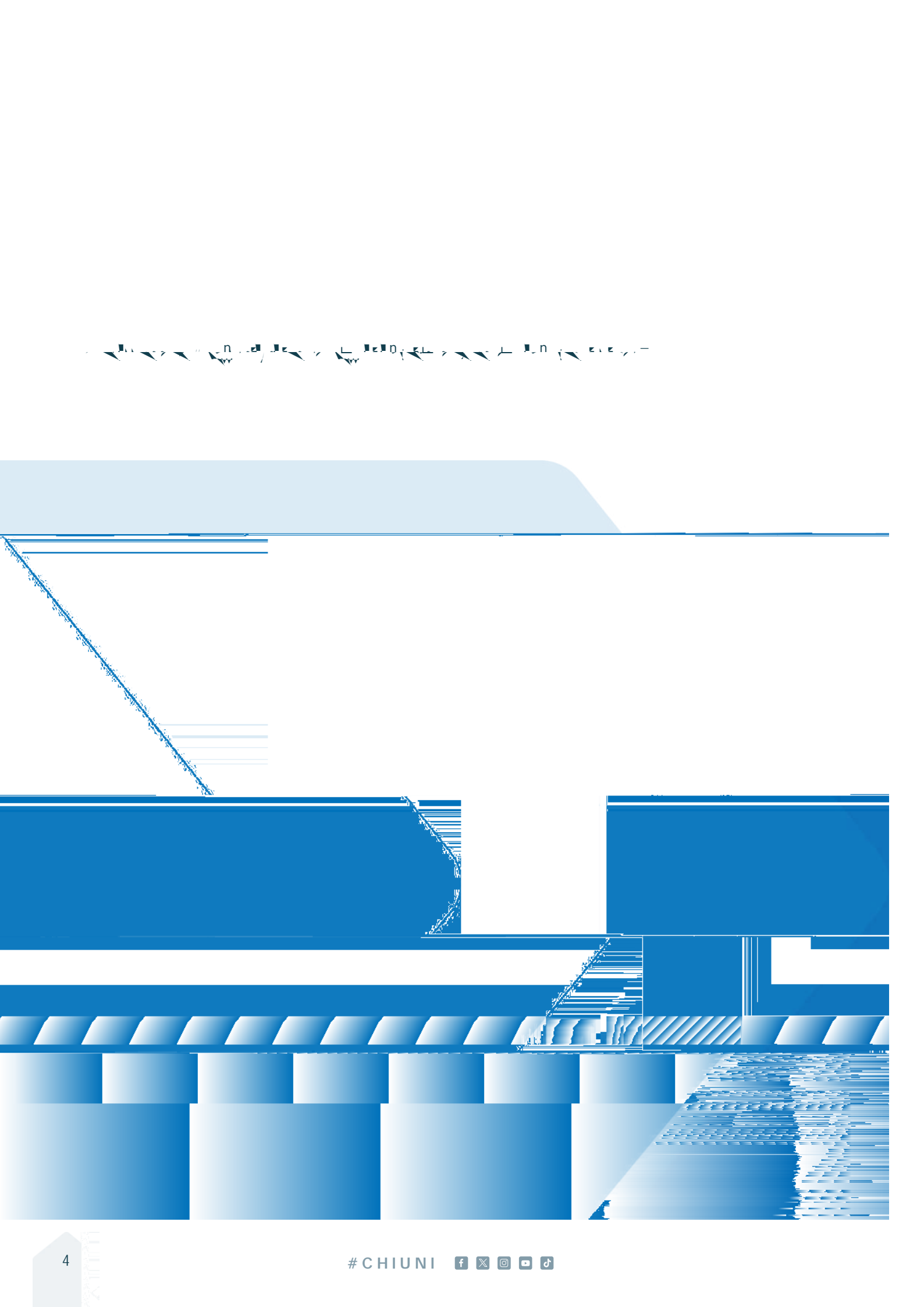
A personal statement is a written statement that you submit as part of your university application. It must be no longer than 47 lines and consist of no more than 4000 characters.

What do universities want to see in an applicant?

Universities want to see that you are a motivated and committed applicant. They want to see that you have a clear understanding of the course you are applying for and that you have the necessary skills and experience to succeed. They also want to see that you are a well-rounded individual with a range of interests and activities.

Use the word 'I' to refer to yourself. Use the word 'we' to refer to your school or college. Use the word 'you' to refer to the reader. Use the word 'they' to refer to other people. Use the word 'it' to refer to an object or thing. Use the word 'its' to refer to the possessive form of 'it'.

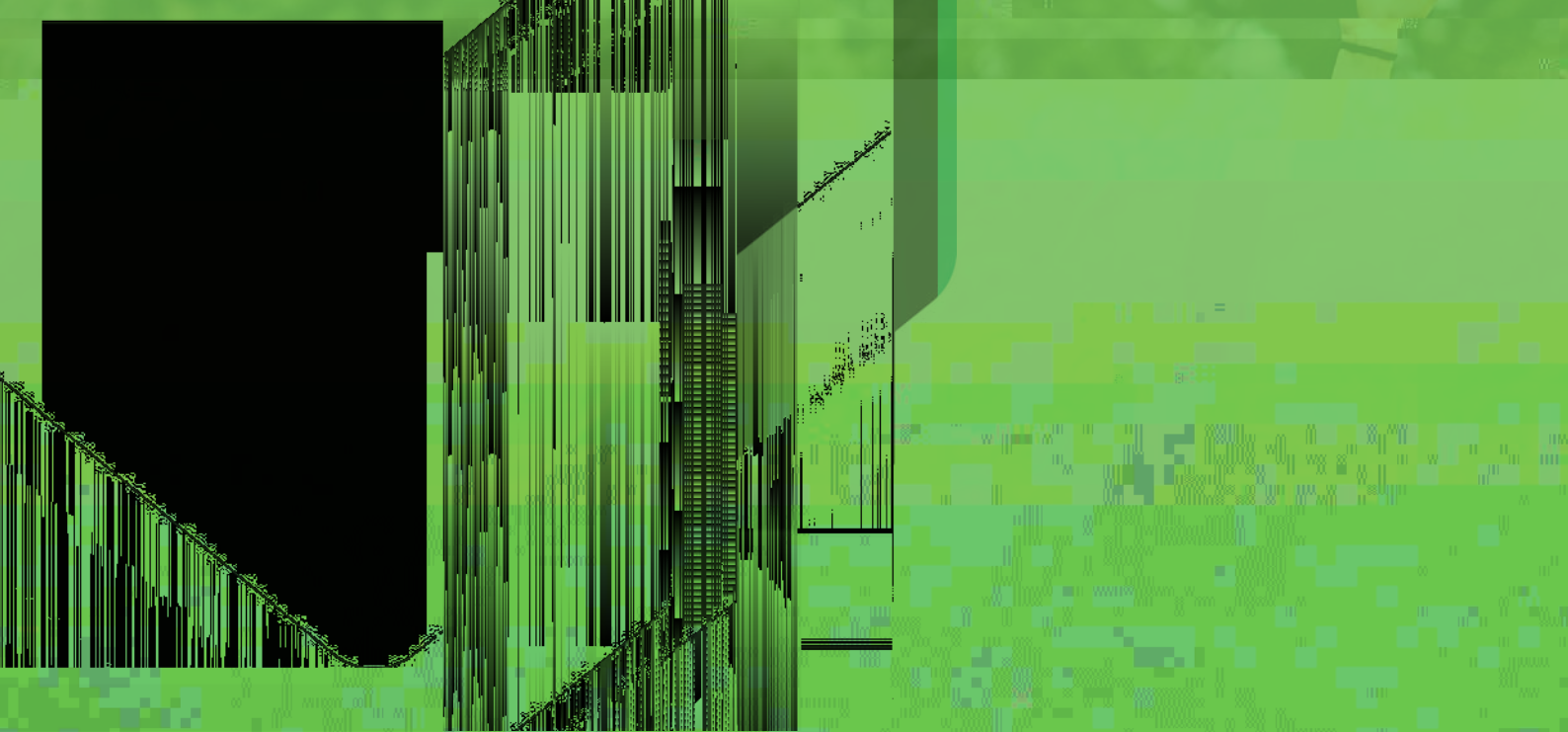
